



# RACKLIFFE HOUSE

now open for Thursday afternoon tours through October 6

**Thursdays, 1:00 - 4:00 p.m.**

**located just 1/2-mile southwest of the Assateague Island Visitor Center**

**The Rackliffe Plantation House**, constructed in the 1740s, is believed to be the only property of its vintage and early Georgian character along the Mid-Atlantic coast, with sublime ocean and coastal bay views, to regularly open to the public.

The House has been restored to its 18th-century grandeur through the efforts

of the Rackliffe House Trust and the Maryland Department of Natural Resources.

Visitors are asked to park at the Assateague Island Visitor Center and hike along the 1/2-mile path located behind the Sarbanes Coastal Ecology Center. Visitors unable to hike that distance are invited to drive to the end

of the path and park on the grassy area to the right of the House.

Visitation to the site is free, but a \$2/person donation is recommended for touring the house. All donations support restoration efforts.
